FINAL JUDGMENT OF FORECLOSURE

THIS ACTION came before the Court on August 12, 2013 for non-jury trial and after hearing the sworn testimony from Connie Jones of SUNTRUST MORTGAGE, INC. and the Defendant, Connie Pedersen, receiving evidence, hearing argument of counsel, reviewing their written closing arguments and being otherwise duly advised in the premises, finds that Plaintiff had standing to file this suit; that Plaintiff holds the original Note, which was surrendered to the Court; that all conditions precedent have been fulfilled; that the Defendant failed to cure the default which resulted in acceleration; that Defendant has no valid defenses to foreclosure and has failed to present any evidence in support of her Counterclaim; that the property securing the debt described in the mortgage is located in Indian River County, Florida; that Plaintiff is entitled to entry of final judgment and that that all loss mitigation efforts have been exhausted.

- 5. Sale of Property. If the total sum with interest at the rate described in paragraph 2 and all costs accrued subsequent to this judgment are not paid, the clerk of this court shall sell the property at public sale on JANUARY 3, 2014 to the highest bidder for cash, except as prescribed in paragraph 6,at www.indian-river.realforeclose.com beginning at 10:00 a.m. in accordance with section 45.031, Florida Statutes The public sale shall not be postponed or canceled without a court order, and shall proceed regardless of whether plaintiff, a plaintiff's representative, or plaintiff's counsel is present. All orders postponing or canceling the sale be filed with the clerk of court no later than 5:00 p.m. two business days before the sale date. Counsel for plaintiff must be certain that the clerk has the original proof of publication of the notice of sale on file no less than three business days before the sale date. Failure to file the original proof of publication of the notice of sale will not stop the sale, however the certificate of sale will not issue until the original proof of publication of notice of sale is filed. The Failure of plaintiff's counsel to properly and timely publish the notice of sale may result in sanctions against the plaintiff, plaintiff's counsel individually, and the law firm representing the plaintiff. If the original proof of publication of the notice of sale is not filed with the clerk within ten calendar days after the sale, an order will be entered directing the plaintiff to show cause why the sale should not be vacated and the case dismissed with or without prejudice. The fact that an attorney has a high volume practice will not be a showing of good cause. Any electronic sale by the clerk shall be in accordance with the written administrative policy for electronic sales published by the clerk at the official website for the clerk and posted in the public areas of the clerk's offices.
- 6. **Costs.** Plaintiff shall advance all subsequent costs of this action and shall be reimbursed for them by the clerk if plaintiff is not the purchaser of the property for sale, provided, however, that the purchaser of the property for sale shall be responsible for the documentary stamps payable on the certificate of title. If plaintiff is the purchaser, the clerk shall credit plaintiff's bid with the total sum with interest and costs accruing subsequent to this judgment, or such part of it, as is necessary to pay the bid in full. The clerk shall receive the service charge imposed in Section 45.031, Florida Statutes.
- 7. **Distribution of Proceeds.** On filing the certificate of title, the clerk shall distribute the proceeds of the sale, so far as they are sufficient, by paying: first, all of plaintiff's costs;

second, documentary stamps affixed to the certificate; third, plaintiff's attorney's fees; forth, the total sum due to plaintiff, less the items paid, plus interest at the rate prescribed in paragraph 2 from this date to the date of the sale; and by retaining any remaining amount pending the further order of this court.

- 8. Right of Redemption. On filing the certificate of sale, defendant(s) and all persons claiming under or against defendant(s) since the filing of the notice of lis pendens shall be foreclosed of all estate or claim in the property, except as to claims or rights under chapter 718 or chapter 720, Florida Statutes, if any.
- 9. Right of Possession. Upon the filing of the certificate of title, the person named on the certificate of title shall be let into possession of the property, subject to the provisions of the "Protection Tenant At Foreclosure Act of 2009,".
- 10. Jurisdiction Retained. Jurisdiction of this action is retained to enter further orders that are proper including, without limitation, a deficiency judgment.
- 11. The Plaintiff may assign its judgment and credit bid by filing an assignment with the Clerk, which the Clerk must accept, without further Order of the Court.
