- 8. **Distribution of Proceeds.** On filing the Certificate of Title, the Clerk shall distribute the proceeds of the sale, so far as they are sufficient, by paying: first, all of the Plaintiff's costs; second, documentary stamps affixed to the Certificate; third, Plaintiff's attorney's fees; fourth, the total sum due to plaintiff, less the item paid, plus interest at the rate prescribed in Paragraph 2 from this date to the date of the sale; and by retaining any remaining amount pending the further order of this Court.
- 9. **Right of Redemption.** On filing of the Certificate of Sale, Defendant(s) and all persons claiming under or against Defendant(s) since the filing of the notice of Lis Pendens shall be foreclosed of all estate or claim in property, except as to claims or rights under chapter 718 or chapter 720, Florida Statues, if any.
