FINAL JUDGMENT OF FORECLOSURE

This action was heard before the court on **June 2, 2017** and on the evidence presented
and being otherwise duly advised in the premises,

IT IS ORDERED AND ADJUDGED that:

1. **Motion Granted for Final Judgment.** There is no dispute of material facts and the
plaintiff is entitled to entry of final judgment.

2. **Value of Claim.** At the initiation of this action, in accordance with section
28.241(1)(a)2.b., Florida Statutes, plaintiff estimated the amount in controversy of the claim to
be \$ 89,535.89]. In accordance with section 28.241(1)(a)2.c., Florida Statutes, the Court
identifies the actual value of the claim to be \$ 105,262.33, as set forth below. For any difference
between the estimated amount in controversy and the actual value of the claim that requires the
filing fee to be adjusted, the Clerk shall adjust the filing fee. In determining whether the filing
fee needs to be adjusted, the graduated filing fee scale in section 28.241(1)(a)2.d., Florida
Statutes, controls. If an excess filing fee was paid, the Clerk shall provide a refund of the excess
fee. If an additional filing fee is owed, the plaintiff shall pay the additional fee at least five

business days prior to the judicial sale. If any additional filing fee owed is not paid prior to the judicial sale, the Clerk shall cancel the judicial sale without further order of the Court.

4. **Interest.** The total amount in Paragraph 3 shall bear interest from this date forward at the prevailing statutory rate of interest.

5. **Lien on Property.** Plaintiff holds a lien for the total sum superior to all claims or estates of defendant(s), (with the exception of any assessments that are superior pursuant to Section 718.116, or 720.3085, Florida Statutes) on the following described property in Indian River County, Florida:

6. **Sale of Property.** If the total sum with interest at the rate described in Paragraph 3 and all costs accrued subsequent to this judgment are not paid, the Clerk of the Court shall sell the property at public sale on August 1, 2017, to the highest bidder for cash, except as prescribed in Paragraph 7, by electronic sale at **Indian River** www.indian-river.realforeclose.com beginning at 10:00 a.m. in accordance with section 45.031, Florida Statutes. **The public sale shall not be postponed or canceled without a court order. All orders postponing or canceling the sale must be filed with the Clerk of Court no later than 5:00 p.m. five (5) business days before the sale date. Counsel for plaintiff must be certain that all sale and Clerk fees are paid and that the original proof of publication is filed no less than five (5) business days before the sale date. Failure to timely file the original proof of publication of the notice of sale and pay the sale and Clerk fees will stop the sale. Additionally, the failure of plaintiff's counsel to pay the sale fee and properly and timely publish the notice of sale may result in sanctions against the plaintiff, plaintiff's counsel individually, and the law firm representing the plaintiff.** Any electronic sale by the Clerk shall be in accordance with the written administrative policy for electronic sales published by the Clerk at the official website for the Clerk and posted in the public areas of the Clerk's offices.

7. **Costs.** Plaintiff shall advance all subsequent costs of this action and shall be reimbursed for them by the Clerk if plaintiff is not the purchaser of the property for sale, provided, however, that the purchaser of the property for sale shall be responsible for the documentary stamps payable on the certificate of title. If plaintiff is the purchaser, plaintiff shall file an affidavit within 5 business days and the Clerk shall credit plaintiff's bid with the total sum with post-judgment interest and costs accruing subsequent to this judgment, or such part of it, as is necessary to pay the bid in full. The Clerk shall receive the service charge imposed in section 45.031, Florida Statutes.

8. **Distribution of Proceeds.** On filing the certificate of title, the Clerk shall distribute the proceeds of the sale, so far as they are sufficient, by paying: first, all of plaintiff's costs; second, documentary stamps affixed to the certificate; third, plaintiff's attorneys' fees; fourth, the total sum due to plaintiff, less the items paid, plus interest at the rate prescribed in Paragraph 3 from this date to the date of the sale; and by retaining any remaining amount pending further order of this court.

9. **Right of Redemption.** On filing the certificate of sale, defendant(s) and all persons claiming under or against defendant(s) since the filing of the notice of lis pendens shall be

foreclosed of all estate or claim in the property, except as to claims or rights under chapter 718 or chapter 720, Florida Statutes, if any.

10. Right of Possession. Upon filing of the certificate of title, the person named on the certificate of title shall be let into possession of the property. If any defendant or tenant remains in possession of the property, an Order Granting the Motion for Writ of Possession shall be entered without further notice or hearing, subject to the purchaser's compliance with Section 83.561, Florida Statutes.

11. Jurisdiction Retained. Jurisdiction of this action is retained to enter further orders that are proper including, without limitation, a deficiency judgment, writs of possession and such supplemental relief or judgments as may be appropriate.
