FINAL SUMMARY JUDGMENT OF FORECLOSURE

THIS ACTION was heard before the Court on Plaintiff's Motion for Summary Final Judgment on October 26, 2018. On the evidence presented,

IT IS ORDERED AND ADJUDGED that:

1. The Plaintiff's Motion for Summary Judgment is GRANTED. Service of process has been duly and regularly obtained over Defendants: MONTY KOFFMAN and THE FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF REVENUE
2. **Amounts Due.** There is due and owing to the Plaintiff SEAQUAY CONDOMINIUM ASSOCIATION, INC. the sum of money as hereinafter set forth:

1. **Interest.** The total amount referenced in Paragraph 2 shall bear the highest post-judgment interest rate allowable by law.
2. **Lien on Property.** Plaintiff, whose address is Seaquay Condominium Association, Inc., 3055 Cardinal Drive, Suite 200, Vero Beach, FL 32963 holds a lien for the total sum specified in Paragraph 2 herein superior to all claims or estates of the defendants and all persons, corporations, or other entities claiming by, through, or under the defendants on the subject property located in property in Indian River County, Florida and described as:

Office # 5 and Office # 6 SEQUAY, a Condominium, according to the Declaration of Condominium dated October 12, 1987, and recorded in Official Records Book 780, Page 2241, Public Records of Indian River County, Florida, as amended, including all common elements and limited common elements declared in said Declaration of Condominium to be appurtenance to the above described Condominium units.

A/K/A: 4800 Highway A1A, Units 5 & 6, Vero Beach, FL 32963

3. **Sale of Property.** If the total sum with interest at the rate described in Paragraph 3 and all costs accrued subsequent to this judgment are not paid, the Clerk of the Court shall sell the subject property at public sale on **December 10, 2018**, to the highest bidder for cash, except as prescribed in Paragraph 6, in accordance with section 45.031, Florida Statutes, using the following method:

[XX] www.indian-river.realforeclose.com, at 10:00 AM,

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after having first given notice as required by Section 45.031, Florida Statutes.

4. **Costs.** Plaintiff shall advance all subsequent costs of this action and shall be reimbursed for them by the Clerk if plaintiff is not the purchaser of the property for sale, provided however, that the purchaser of the property for sale shall be responsible for the documentary stamps payable on the certificate of title. If plaintiff is the purchaser, the Clerk shall credit plaintiff's bid with the total sum with interest and costs accruing subsequent to this judgment, or such part of it, as is necessary to pay the bid in full.
5. **Right of Redemption.** On filing of the Certificate of Sale, defendant's right of redemption as proscribed by Florida Statutes, Section 45.0315 shall be terminated.
6. **Distribution of Proceeds.** On filing the Certificate of Title, the Clerk shall distribute the proceeds of the sale, so far as they are sufficient, by paying: first, all of the plaintiff's costs; second, documentary stamps affixed to the Certificate; third, plaintiff's attorneys' fees; fourth, the total sum due to the plaintiff, less the items paid, plus interest at the rate prescribed in paragraph 3 from this date to the date of the sale; and by retaining any remaining amount pending the further order of this court.
7. **Right of Possession.** Upon filing of the Certificate of Title, defendant and all persons claiming under or against defendant since the filing of the Notice of Lis Pendens shall be foreclosed of all estate or claim in the property and the purchaser at sale shall be let into possession of the property.
8. **Attorney Fees.** The Court finds, based upon the affidavits presented and upon inquiry of counsel for the plaintiff, a flat rate fee of \$700.00 plus that 27.90 hours were reasonably expended by plaintiff's counsel and that an hourly rate of \$275.00 is appropriate. PLAINTIFF'S COUNSEL REPRESENTS THAT THE ATTORNEY FEE AWARDED DOES NOT EXCEED ITS CONTRACT FEE WITH THE PLAINTIFF. The Court finds that there are no reduction or enhancement factors for consideration by the Court pursuant to Florida Patient's Compensation Fund v. Rowe, 472 So.2d 1145 (Fla. 1985).
9. **Retained Jurisdiction.** Jurisdiction of this action is retained to enter further orders that are proper including, without limitation, a deficiency judgment or for an order reopening the case to allow the Plaintiff to foreclose on any party not named in the original complaint.
10. **NOTICE PURSUANT TO AMENDMENT TO SECTION. 45.031. FLA. ST. (2006)**

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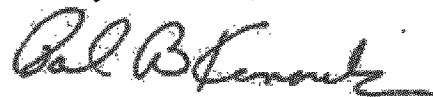
