AND PLACING DEFENDANT ON PROBATION

This cause coming on this day to be heard before me, and you, the defendant, Alvin Leeshon Legett  
and in the presence of his atty. APD HENRY WHITTON, being now present before me, and you

having: ~~ENTERED A PLEA OF NOLO CONTENDERE TO~~  
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~~ENTERED A PLEA OF NOLO CONTENDERE TO~~  
the offense of CARRYING A CONCEALED FIREARM

It appearing to the satisfaction of the Court that you are not likely again to engage in a criminal course of conduct, and that the ends of justice and the welfare of society do not require that you should presently be adjudged guilty and suffer the penalty authorized by law;

Now, therefore, it is ordered and adjudged that the adjudication of guilt and imposition of sentence are hereby withheld, and that you are hereby placed on probation for a period of (3) THREE YEARS under the supervision of the Department of Corrections and its officers, such supervision to be subject to the provisions of the laws of this State.

It is further ordered that you shall comply with the following conditions of probation:

- (1) Not later than the fifth day of each month, you will make a full and truthful report to your Probation Officer on the form provided for that purpose.
- (2) You will pay to the State of Florida the amount of Thirty Dollars (\$30) per month toward the cost of your supervision unless otherwise waived in compliance with Florida Statutes.
- (3) You will not change your residence or employment or leave the county of your residence without first procuring the consent of your Probation Officer.
- (4) You will neither possess, carry or own any weapons or firearm without first securing the consent of your Probation Officer.
- (5) You will live and remain at liberty without violating any law. A conviction in a court of law shall not be necessary in order for such a violation to constitute a violation of your probation.
- (6) You will not use intoxicants to excess; nor will you visit places where intoxicants, drugs or other dangerous substances are unlawfully sold, dispensed or used.
- (7) You will work dilligently at a lawful occupation and support any dependents to the best of your ability as directed by your Probation Officer.
- (8) You will promptly and truthfully answer all inquiries directed to you by the Court or the Probation Officer, and allow the Officer to visit in your home, at your employment site or elsewhere, and you will comply with all instructions he may give you.

(9), (10), and (11) on reverse side.

You are hereby placed on notice that the Court may at any time rescind or modify any of the conditions of your probation, or may extend the period of probation as authorized by law, or may discharge you from further supervision; and that if you violate any of the conditions of your probation, you may be arrested and the Court may revoke your probation, adjudge you guilty and impose any sentence which it might have imposed before placing you on probation.

It is further ordered that when you have reported to the Probation Officer and have been instructed as to the conditions of probation you shall be released from custody if you are in custody and if you are at liberty on bond, the sureties thereon shall stand discharged from liability.

It is further ordered that the Clerk of this Court file this order in his office, record the same in the Minutes of the Court, and forthwith provide certified copies of same to the Probation Officer for his use in compliance with the requirements of law.

- ( ) You will pay to the Circuit Court, and Court Costs, payable to the Clerk of the Circuit Court, within sixty (60) days of your release.
- ( ) You will pay Criminal Justice Trust Fund, and County Resolution Criminal Justice Trust Fund, payable to the Clerk of the Circuit Court.
- ( 9 ) You will pay \$200 Court Costs to the Clerk of the Circuit Court, or perform 50 hours community service work, as directed by your Probation Officer.
- ( ) You will pay Fine, plus a surcharge, for a total of , to the Clerk of the Circuit Court, as directed by your Probation Officer.
- ( ) You will pay Public Defender Fees, plus Costs, to the Clerk of the Circuit Court, or perform hours of community service work, as directed by your Probation Officer.
- ( ) You will pay restitution to, through the Department of Corrections, at a rate of per month, or according to a plan and schedule as directed by your Probation Officer.
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- ( ) You will serve in the County Jail, beginning with credit for time served.
- ( ) You will serve in the County Jail, beginning to be served on the Weekend Work Program/Weekends.
- ( ) You will remain drug free during the term of your probation.
- ( 10 ) You will receive an alcohol/substance abuse ~~evaluation~~ evaluation, and follow any recommended treatment, at your own expense, as directed by your Probation Officer.
- ( ) You will enter and successfully complete an in-patient drug/alcohol rehabilitation program, at your own expense, as directed by your Probation Officer.
- ( ) You must submit to a urinalysis, breathalyzer, or blood test, at any time, and at your own expense, if requested by your Probation Officer, or the professional staff at any treatment center where you are receiving treatment, to determine the possible use of alcohol or controlled substances.
- ( ) You will consume no alcoholic beverages or enter any establishment where the primary business is the sale of alcoholic beverages.
- ( ) You will attend a minimum of Alcoholics Anonymous/Narcotics Anonymous Meetings per week.
- ( 11 ) You will perform 800 hours of community service work, as assigned by your Probation Officer, but 600 of these hours may be forgiven on an hour per hour basis for gainful employment when such employment is maintained at a minimum rate of thirty (30) hours per week.
- ( ) You will have no contact with .
- ( ) You will work toward the completion of your General Equivalency Diploma (GED), as directed by your Probation Officer.
- ( ) You will forfeit the weapon confiscated in this Case.
- ( ) You will observe a curfew from P.M. to A.M. daily, unless given specific permission by your Probation Officer to leave your approved place of residence.
